In 1150 AD, Bhaskaracarya (b. 1114 AD), renowned mathematician and astronomer of Vedic tradition composed *Lilavati* as the first part of his larger work called *Siddhanta Siromani*, a comprehensive exposition of arithmetic, algebra, geometry, mensuration, number theory and related topics. *Lilavati* has been used as a standard textbook for about 800 years. The present work is an enlargement of his Marathi work and attempts a thorough mathematical explanation of definitions, formulae, short cuts and methodology as intended by Bhaskara. Stitches are followed by literal translations so that the reader can enjoy and appreciate the beauty of accurate and musical presentation in *Lilavati*.
